- Grammar and lexical structures of Greek and Latin languages.
- Ability to use the tools and techniques of information gathering used in historiography, classical philology, archaeology, and other human and social sciences.
- Ability to present the results of research and to comment on, annotate or edit sources of all kinds correctly, in accordance with the critical standards of the discipline.
- National and local History.
- World history and European history from comparative perspectives and as a whole.
- Reading, comprehension, and translation of Greek and Latin texts.
- Comparative linguistics applied to classical languages.
- Methods and problems from different approaches and specializations in historical research: chronological periods, geographical areas, different and changing thematic approaches.
- Methods and techniques of other human sciences and ability to use them.
- Periodization and history of Greek and Latin literature.
- The heritage and contemporary relevance of classical culture.
- Prosody and metrics of classical languages.
- Religions of the classical world.
- Transmission and edition of classical texts.
